

This year's goal is to raise \$1.7 million in unrestricted funds.

Each year through the Archbishop Hannan Community Appeal (AHCA), volunteers work to raise unrestricted funds to support Catholic Charities' outreach to meet the needs of the poor and the vulnerable in our community. We are especially excited for this year's efforts because it marks 50 years of service to the community!

Hope Haven is Now an Approved Medicaid Provider



The volunteer numbers for the last fiscal year are in! Between July 2014 and June 2015, Catholic Charities has benefitted from the help of some **12, 446 volunteers** giving a total of **332,018 hours** of their time. A LEGACY OF FAITHFULNESS CONTINUES WITH YOU

The Catechism of the Catholic Church clearly states: (2447) "The works of mercy are charitable

actions by which we come to the aid of our neighbor in his spiritual and bodily necessities." The works of mercy are divided into two groups: corporal and spiritual. The spiritual works include praying, instructing, advising, consoling and comforting. The corporal works of mercy consist of providing food, shelter, clothing,

visiting the sick and imprisoned, and burying the dead. The corporal and spiritual works of mercy concisely define the mission and the work of Catholic Charities Archdiocese of New Orleans.

Deaf Action Center

Shari Bernius is literally a calm presence in the midst of chaos. While most in the Greater New Orleans Area might not even notice her, for a special population of people, her service is vital. Shari is the director of Catholic Charities Deaf Action Center, which provides professional sign language interpretation by certified interpreters for people who are deaf, deaf-blind or hard of hearing, so at some of the city's most critical points, Shari and her team make sure that those with a hearing disability have the information they need to care for themselves and their families

"It means a lot to me that we are able to share important messages from important people with the deaf community. For me it's not about who the presenter is, it's about our deaf community having the same ability to get the same messages as hearing people," said Bernius.

From news conferences with the Mayor of New Orleans to city emergency preparedness and response briefings to signing for visiting presidents, Shari has been a mainstay for the New Orleans deaf community for 25 years.
