Refugee Mentor Program

While the case managers provide direct, holistic assistance to refugee individuals and families, many refugees face challenges in their social/ cultural integration to life in the U.S.

The Refugee Mentor Program connects refugee families with local communities, services and resources. Volunteer mentors will build relationships with refugee families and encourage self-sufficiency in America.



How the Mentor Program works

Volunteers commit to mentoring and supporting a refugee or refugee family for at least 4-8 hours a week for 6 months. Mentors and mentees determine convenient meeting locations and times each week.

Mentors are provided initial training and ongoing support from the Mentor Coordinator to meet their refugee families' self-sufficiency goals.

Mentors help refugees by:

- Orienting them to the social/cultural/ professional norms
- Helping them develop self-sufficiency skills to meet their personal or family-specific goals
- Acquainting them with public transportation and navigation, markets, schools, libraries, the postal system, banking, currency, taxes, etc.
- Encouraging spoken English and giving them the opportunity to practice language skills
- Being a friend and social support when needed

Time commitment

The minimum commitment for mentors is 4-8 hours per week for 6 months. Mentors must attend a Catholic Charities volunteer orientation and the Refugee Mentor training. Mentors must also be available for ongoing communication with the Refugee Mentor Coordinator regarding your mentor family's integration goals.

Location of volunteer position

Refugee Mentor Program offices and trainings are held at Catholic Charities Immigration & Refugee Services office at 2505 Maine Ave, Metairie, LA 70003. Mentoring will take place at various locations across Greater New Orleans area. Mentors and their families will decide on a mutually convenient time/place to meet.

Qualifications

- Must be at least 18 years old
- Able to work with and relate to people from diverse backgrounds
- Demonstrate cultural sensitivity and
- non-judgmental relationship building
- Fluency in Amharic, Arabic, Burmese, Haitian Creole, Spanish, or Tigrinya beneficial but not required
- Good listening skills, patient and welcoming personality
