

# **Project SAVE Client Finds Relief with Program**

tober is Domestic Violence Awareness Month and Catholic Charities' Project SAVE helps those suffering with domestic violence. Project SAVE assists survivors of domestic violence residing in Orleans Parish to obtain free emergency legal representation.

Staff attorneys help with legal orders to keep survivors of domestic violence safe and to protect their legal rights. These legal services may include temporary restraining and protective orders, temporary child support, temporary custody, and temporary use of property. Attorneys may also make referrals to other social services and/or legal agencies as necessary.

One such Project SAVE client, Kim, came to Project SAVE for help with a domestic violence problem. Kim has been working with Staff Attorney, Joan Miller, ever since she reached out to the program.

Clients often file their protective order with the help of the Court Help Desk, who walk the clients through every step of the process. Once the protective

order is filed with the court, they are referred to local organizations that can help represent them through their case.

Ivanna worked with the Court Help Desk and after her protective order was filed, she reached out to Project SAVE for representation in court.

"Kim came to us after filing her protective order. I worked to gather evidence to ensure we could be awarded the protective order from her abuser," Project SAVE staff attorney, Joan Miller, said. "Kim was a great asset for herself and a great witness against her abuser. Now she has the protective order and can feel comfortable caring for her young children."

Kim spoke about the difficulty of going through the protective order process alone and how Project SAVE and Joan gave her strength throughout the process. Kim's abuser was a repeat offender and she is thankful for Project SAVE and Joan Miller for empowering her stand up.

"When you're going through a domestic violence situation, you aren't in the best mindset dealing with the court," Kim said. "People like Joan and Project SAVE helped me every step of the way and assured me that I would be heard. She empowered me to keep up with what we established in court. She was invaluable and a way out for me!"

Kim stresses the importance of filling police reports and following through with the difficult protective order process with the courts.
