# A Collaboration to Assist Asylum Seekers

mmigration attorneys along with their legal teams and social service case workers joined forces for an all-day workshop to assist individuals facing a filing deadline to prepare their asylum applications.

"This required the entire team and took months of planning. Each one of

the team played an instrumental role in making it all work and run smoothly," said Shaula Lovera, Division Director at CCANO.

Raquel Fonte, (pictured), Senior Staff Attorney at CCANO Immigration & Refugee Services, primarily handles cases involving unaccompanied minors. However, in response to the increased legal assistance needs of recent arrivals, including single adults and families, she and her Legal Assistant, Ana Mendieta, organized a full day event providing help with a critical part of the asylum process for a severely underserved segment of the immigrant community. "We had individuals from Venezuela, Mexico, Cuba, Honduras, Guatemala, Nicaragua and Haiti at the asylum clinic. Eighteen people walked out with an application packet to be filed, and two were taken on by our program as new clients, due to the compelling circumstances of their particular cases."

Those interested in participating in the clinic were identified and signed up by the reception office at

Immigration & Refugee Office located at St. Lawrence in Metairie, where the clinic was held. Participants were scheduled to first meet with legal assistance for a preliminary intake, then moved through stations set up to prepare the various parts of the application. Each participant received an attorney consultation as well as access to social workers who were there to

provide support and information regarding services and resources available to newcomers.

"It was such a successful event that we already are in the planning stages of the next one.!" Proclaimed Raquel. "Besides getting to provide a valuable service for individuals who otherwise would not be able to access legal services, this was a great opportunity for our legal and social services teams to collaborate in person and in new, creative ways," she added.
