Not only do we get a break from the unrelenting Louisiana heat of the past few months, but as we near the holiday season, I am reminded to be thankful for good health and, even with so much uncertainty in the world, that there is still hope and help available for those who are most vulnerable. With this said, each fall, I am *grateful* to kick off our annual Archbishop Hannan Community Appeal (AHCA) campaign.

Started in 1965 by Archbishop Philip M. Hannan, the astounding response each year to this vital appeal speaks volumes about the impact & need of Catholic Charities' numerous programs, including housing, homelessness, seniors, children, families, health and behavioral health, immigration, justice, employment and disaster response. For some, your support allows us to pay for the many expenses not covered by governmental funding or foundation grants. Our goal this year is \$1.75 million, and I am proud to say that 94 cents of every dollar



raised from the AHCA goes directly to client services. I am also grateful for the thoughtful leadership of Anne and Jack Dardis, who will serve as our AHCA campaign chairs this year. You can read more about this inspiring couple on the next page.

In addition to launching the AHCA campaign, Catholic Charities, along with the New Orleans Council on Aging, was fortunate to partner with Entergy New Orleans in September for their Heat Relief Financial Assistance Program. Catholic Charities helped distribute more than \$400,000 for energy bill relief for low-income households and for elderly or disabled customers impacted by the extreme heat. As always, I am grateful for this opportunity to put our faith and values into action.

I am humbled by the challenging work happening behind the scenes at Catholic Charities and beyond. With more than 73,000 people assisted last year, it shows that there is strength in unity, and I am grateful to be a part of it.

Dardises Blessed to Honor Memory of Archbishop Hannan as AHĆA Campaign Chairs

f you ever have the opportunity to meet Anne and Jack Dardis, you will often hear the words "very blessed." It is easy to see why. Both native New Orleanians and lifelong Catholics, they have been married for 56 years, raised 10 children, and spend as much time as possible doting over their 35 grandchildren (with one on the way.)

Anne and Jack acknowledge their good fortune and strong familial bonds would not be possible without a solid foundation rooted in faith. Through their long involvement within the community and shared personal experiences, they are keenly aware that many others are not always as fortunate as they are. This has also made them mindful of the impact of the annual Archbishop Hannan Community Appeal (AHCA), and how its success each year supports the 23 essential programs at Catholic Charities.

The AHCA was named in memory of Archbishop Philip M. Hannan, its founder, as a way of honoring his life's legacy of service to the poor in our community. The annual volunteer-driven campaign supports the works of Catholic Charities, raising funds for the many challenges facing our

Not long after launching the campaign (formerly the Archbishop's Community Appeal) in 1967, Archbishop Hannan asked her father, Harry Charbonnet, to serve as the first chair of the campaign. She just simply hopes she and Jack can help make a difference, much like her father did nearly 60 years ago.

Anne added, "It's a great opportunity for people to help all of God's special and needy people and there are so many of them."
